SWDWP Waste Contract - Proposed Energy from Waste plant

MVV Umwelt, one of Germany's leading Energy from Waste companies, has been shortlisted by South West Devon Waste Partnership for its waste disposal contract to provide an Energy from Waste plant to treat municipal waste in South West Devon.

The company has submitted two proposals to SWDWP, one for a site at Ernesettle and the other at North Yard, Devonport Dockyard. If the company is selected as preferred bidder, it would only develop a solution at one of these sites. MVV is holding two public exhibitions next week to publicise its initial proposals.

Paul Carey, Managing Director of MVV Environment, the UK subsidiary company, said:

'MVV is committed to public consultation. We are holding these public exhibitions to give local people the chance to view our initial proposals, discuss them with the project team and to ask us questions.'
