MVV enters UK with Carey as MD

AS PART of an expansion into the UK waste management market, German-based Energy from Waste (EfW) specialist, MVV Umwelt, has appointed Paul Carey to the position of managing director.

Carey will be responsible for developing and expanding the company in the UK, following the formation of MVV Environment.

MVV said it aims to focus on "developing a UKbased company that can grow through PFI projects, acquisitions and merchant plant, sharing best practice with its German parent".

Paul Carey, MD of MVV Environment, said: "MVV has a proven track record and can bring something new to the UK waste management debate."

Holger Franke, head of development for MVV Umwelt in Germany, added: "We are delighted to have Paul Carey leading MVV in the UK."

MVV is said to be the third largest in Germany's EfW sector, currently working with 25 municipalities and districts in five federal states. The company said it manages and disposes of the waste from more than 4.3 million people across the country.
