

MVV and Gilpin disappointed at Devon County Council's decision to refuse recycling scheme

MVV Environment Devonport and Sam Gilpin Demolition Ltd expressed disappointment at the decision by Devon County Council's Development Management Committee to turn down their application for a Materials Recovery Facility and an Incinerator Bottom Ash processing facility at Whitecleave Quarry, Buckfastleigh. The scheme had been recommended for approval by the County Council's Planning Officers. However, members decided, after a lengthy debate, to reject the proposal.

Paul Carey, Managing Director of MVV Environment Devonport Ltd, said:

"We are naturally disappointed at the decision by Devon County Council's Development Management Committee to reject our planning application. The grounds for refusal are unclear and we await the decision from Devon County Council, but subject to that we will make an appeal."
