

# MVV publishes more details of proposals for Energy from Waste plant

Following a meeting with councillors from the member authorities of the South West Devon Waste Partnership, MVV Environment Devonport Ltd has issued further plans and drawings, giving more details of its proposals for an Energy from Waste plant at North Yard, HM Naval Base Devonport.

Paul Carey, Managing Director of MVV, said:

'Because of the high level of interest in the proposals we are releasing further drawings now before the public exhibitions. We hope that the additional elevations and landscape drawing will give people a better idea of what the plant could look like, and the photomontages will show how it sits in the site.'

The site will include a visitors' centre which will be used by the Partnership and the local community for various purposes, including educational activities. Once the Local Liaison Committee has been set up, MVV would be asking members for suggestions for its further use. Mr Carey said that Blackies Wood, which also formed part of the site and was currently unused, would be tidied up and could be used by local people, possibly as a nature conservation area or for recreational purposes.

Mr Carey added that he hoped people would take the opportunity to study the proposals in more detail at the series of roadshows that are being held jointly with South West Devon Waste Partnership, and to register their interest in joining the Local Liaison Committee.
