Inside the MVV Energy from Waste plant at Devonport

Ever wondered what happens to your residual waste, after you have done your recycling? You know, the stuff that just can't be recycled and used to be buried in landfill sites.

Here's the answer- We use it as fuel to generate electricity and heat for the Dockyard, with surplus electricity exported to the National Grid. We are therefore part of the energy revolution, generating partly renewable energy from your non-recyclable waste. Since 2015, we have diverted around 1.75 million tonnes of residual waste from landfill and generated over 1.25 million megawatts of electricity.

Our partner councils, Plymouth, Devon County and Torbay are all working hard to encourage people to recycle as much as possible and, more importantly, reduce the amount of waste bought and thrown away in the first place. But there will always be something that can't be recycled, and that's where MVV's Energy from Waste Combined Heat and Power Facility comes into its own. Lorries deliver the waste, collected by the partner councils, at one end and useful energy comes out of the other. We burn 30 tonnes of waste an hour at 1,000 degrees in a large furnace, which is visible through glass portholes. The ash from the fire is taken to Exeter for recycling.

Happy Bees Happy World Bee Day

Thanks to our friends at Pollenize CIC, we celebrated World Bee Day with our own colony of European Honey Bees this year!

Probably the best known of all pollinating insects, bees include the famous Honey Bee, as well as the equally important Solitary Bees and Bumblebees. Among all pollinators, bees are unique. In addition to sipping nectar to fuel their own flight, they are one of the few animals to actively gather large amounts of pollen (and hence inadvertently move pollen from flower

to flower). More than one-third of the world's crop species such as alfalfa seed, sunflower, and numerous fruits and vegetables depend on bee pollination, representing billions in economic worth every year.

Unfortunately, due to factors such as habitat loss, chemical use and climate change, global bee populations are in drastic decline.

MVV are delighted to be a part of the amazing work that Pollenize do in Plymouth and beyond, combining community rewilding and scientific research to protect bees and all pollinating insects.
